

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#### **Editorial Overview**

The visual artists in FNQ are keeping very busy making artworks to display in the various annual art exhibitions planned by member groups over the next few months. There are also many workshops offered for artists wanting to improve their skills.

Innovative design sought for Cairns Gallery Precinct. The search has begun for innovative, world-class designs for a new gallery for the Cairns Gallery Precinct. The new gallery will enhance the existing precinct, which connects three heritage listed buildings – the Cairns Art Gallery, the Court House and the former Mulgrave Shire Council office – and the site of the former Council administration building at 51 The Esplanade. Expressions of Interest (EOI) opened 23 July for the project, which also includes a master plan outlining how the four exhibition spaces will work together to create a unique cultural experience that will be heralded as a destination showcasing First Nations artwork as well as exhibitions from across Australia and internationally.

Why are there no advertising signs placed in both Cairns Art Gallery and the Courthouse Gallery guiding the public to visit both galleries? It is great that Cairns Regional Council wishes to create a Cairns Gallery Precinct and that it has already made the Court house into another gallery, however despite several suggestions from the Visual Arts Association to both Mica Martin CEO and Destry Puia General Manager of Lifestyle and Community - Cairns Regional Council- that some advertising signs could be placed in both Galleries guiding the public to Exhibitions held in the other gallery, nothing has been done. Do we have to wait until the Cairns Gallery precinct is finished before signs indicating the various galleries will be in place?

The Arts and Cultural Map has been developed by the Cairns Regional Council to underscore the depth and breadth of arts and culture in the region. A Cairns Arts and Culture Map Information Session was held by Council 27 July 2022 and artists were encouraged to get on the map. #### Participating Riga Artists: To Be Announced

This will be the final exhibition presented under the banner of InkMasters as it hands over its assets and studio space to NorthSite Arts. Last year InkMasters celebrated its 10<sup>th</sup> year of operation and its 5<sup>th</sup> InkFest biennale but has had to wind up as an organization due to lack of financial administrative support. The Committee voted to annex its resources and 55 Greenslopes Street studio (formerly Djumbunji Press) to NorthSite Gallery. The committee is delighted to know that the new management under Ashleigh Campbell will continue serving the arts community with programs and printmaking activities, with its diverse membership of some100 members and volunteers.

My thanks to all the participating artists, much appreciated and reliable correspondent Lone White, Courthouse Gallery Director and IM benefactor Chris Stannard, generous Sister-City Council Rep, Sim Hayward and patient, hardworking Valerija Zirdzina of Riga Cultural Arts. The Ukraine war has pressed Latvian Council workers into overdrive as this exhibition comes at a time of national emergency against non-democratic loving forces - perhaps offering some needed 'sisterly' relief for army personnel, art-lovers, citizens and refugees of Riga.







White Gums & Ramoxes was a touring exhibition curated by Grace Cochrane, sourced from the collection of the Bundanon Trust. Although it focussed on the collaborative ceramics of Merric Boyd & his son Arthur, paintings & drawings relating to their pottery activities were included.

Merric Boyd, holds the distinction of being the father of Australian studio pottery and is a primary figure in the story of Australian studio ceramics. He developed expressive ceramic forms in an Art Nouveau style, and held the first solo exhibition of studio pottery in Australia, in 1912.

The title White Gums & Ramoxes echoes characteristic motifs in the work of the father & son artists: Memic was preoccupied with interpretations of trees, while Arthur's 'ramox' pertains to his interest in metamorphosed & hybrid figures.

# Fakes & Forgeries in Silver

Jolyon Warwick James is Silver Historian, Honorary Associate of MAAS (Sydney), Government approved valuer under the Cultural Gifts Program, and President of the Silver Society of Australia and member of LAPADA, a Freeman of the Worshipful Company of Goldsmiths and Fellow of the Society of Antiquaries, shares his knowledge of forging and methods of detecting them.

Jolyon will explain various forms of faking, and what is not fake. He explains what part Hallmarking plays in preventing faking; and the weapons used against the fakers! Then there's what may be fake in one country and not in another.



To secure the grounds for the elaborate plans for his garden and castle, Fouquet purchased and demolished three villages employing the displaced people to work in the gardens. Eighteen thousand fully employed during the project.









King Louis XIV was enraged at the dazzling castle, outrageously lavish for someone in his employ, so Fouquet arrested, declared bankrupt, and imprisoned for life. Madame Fouquet was exiled. The king seized, confiscated or purchased one hundred and twenty tapestries, and all orange trees in the opulent gardens. The artistic genius of the ultra-wealthy Nicolas Fouquet was his undoing!

**Sandra Bruce** said the NPPP never fails to deliver a range of emotions. "This edition, the 15<sup>th</sup> in the series, is no exception. It is such a privilege to be allowed access into the personal lives of others in an exhibition that offers a sweeping view of the nation's experience."

I'm sure I drew inspiration and details for the shot from memories of my brothers and I when growing up in the area, being out in the open catching, spearing, and trapping fish whenever we could.

It was a job containing the kids once they hit the beach, but when I got them into a rough position and spoke to them very softly about how special this picture was, they gave me their full attention."

#### Whitsundays Arts Festival Art Prize Exhibition

Entries were open to Australian artists aged 16 and above working in any 2D or 3D medium (excluding photographs). Artists were able to submit up to two works. In 2021, the Art Prize Exhibition received over 100 artwork submissions, with 53 finalists selected.

The works will be on display in the Coral Sea Marina Resort from 23 September to 30 September, with winners to be announced at the opening night event, which welcomes the public to attend. Attendees will also be able to vote for their favourite art piece in the 'People's Choice Award', which last year had over 1,000 votes.

The full finalist gallery will also be made available online on 23 September for interested parties to view and purchase works from. The Festival aims to endorse and encourage arts practice, and the online gallery is just another way for emerging and established artists to promote and sell their works.

Briefly, eco printing is a process whereby natural dyes and tannins within leaves and flowers of plants transfer their shape, colour and marks to make a print on fabric and paper.

#### About the Major Grant Round

There are two RADF Major Grant Rounds annually. The Second Major Grant rounds **for 2022 ends in September for projects that can start from January.** 

The Major Grant Round is broad, encompassing and includes all arts streams. This category offers support towards projects and programs that create vibrant arts and cultural experiences, including but not limited to:

- performances and exhibitions

#### **ATHERTON**

The local RADF program is managed through a **RADF Committee**, who assess the range of applications. We offer quick response Small Grants of up to \$1000 for training and professional development or small scale community projects. There is also a quick response Resource Grant of up to \$500 to access a range of resources to support a specific arts project. See the **guidelines** for more details. Quick response grants are available at any time, subject to at least six weeks prior notice and availability of funds. We also offer two major funding rounds each year for projects up to \$5000 each, and may consider an out-of-round grant, or a larger amount, on request.

RADF grants are assessed and allocated according to criteria outlined in the program guidelines and priorities identified in the **Arts and Cultural Plan**.



I am a local Cairns based artist and started the creative process of working with stained glass as a hobby about 15 years ago.

My Glass Tree sculptures were initially designed to depict the essence of Far North Queensland and now I have progressed to a more global view of the natural world. This was due to the Cairns Art Society offering as a theme for the annual exhibition – "A Changing World". Unfortunately, that exhibition was never held due to Covid, but I helped me to broaden my creativity process.

I really enjoy working with both the timber and the stain glass. The organic

style of the local upcycled timbers makes a dramatic contrast to the amazing colours and different textures of the stained glass. The telling moment of creating the glass trees is when I stand them up as prior to this I have only my creativity to rely on and don't really know what they will look like.

I have had my own exhibition at the Kite Gallery and have won several awards at the Cairns Art Society exhibitions and I recently won 1st prize for the 3D section and 1st prize in the sculpture section at the Cairns Show Association Visual Arts Exhibition. The best part of the whole journey has been meeting and engaging with the local art community.
